# FIND YOUR GOOD AND DO



I CAN'T STRESS **STRONGLY ENOUGH THE IMPORTANCE** OF THE CVSI **FREE VISION** SCREENINGS.

On a recent Sunday Morning, the CBS newsmagazine program, a segment featured Jon Bon Jovi's JBJ Soul Kitchen, a series of restaurants the rocker opened that help feed the needy. Bon Jovi, a Grammy-winning artist who's sold millions of records, described the sense of fulfillment he receives from helping another human being, stating, "The way to feel good is to do good, you know? Find your good and do it."

For over 30 years Northern Plains Eye Foundation (NPEF) has found "it's good" and, through community outreach, "do it," by helping people see - to learn, work, play, and live full and independent lives. Ensuring people see well begins with young children. Do you know babies need their vision checked? Preschoolers should have their eyes examined before starting school? Kids need their vision checked regularly because their eyes change as they grow? They do.

That's why NPEF's Children's Vision Screening Initiative (CVSI) free children's vision screenings are at the forefront of Foundation outreach. CVSI statistics reveal undetected vision disorders impact almost 12% of our children screened - that's over 600 kids every year. Often the child is simply in need of an eye exam and glasses, but other times conditions like amblyopia, or even cataracts, have been discovered - that without a vision screening - could have led to long-term vision loss or even blindness.

As parents, we inherently tend to think our children see well and something like this happens to "other kids." At NPEF's recent Casino Royale Charity Affair, Jackie Waldie shared the story of her and husband, Lyn, and their son, Seth, who was screened through CVSI and referred for a comprehensive eve exam. Jackie is a teacher and special education advocate, so in learning Seth's CVSI screening indicated risk factors were detected requiring a comprehensive eye exam, she was a bit dismayed. "I had no idea. He always sat close to the TV, but I thought that was because he loved Thomas the Tank Engine and was fascinated by the show."

She went on to describe, after receiving the results of Seth's CVSI screening, taking Seth to their family ophthalmologist, Dr. Scott Eccarius, and learning of Seth's diagnosis of strabismic amblyopia. "His right eye was turned and not working at all," she said. With glasses and amblyopia therapy, Seth's eye turn has been corrected with his vision in that eye returning, and he is now seeing 20/25 with correction.

Concerned by Seth's diagnosis, Jackie and Lyn decided to have Dr. Eccarius perform a comprehensive eye exam on Seth's younger sister, Emily. Emily had a similar diagnosis and was prescribed glasses and amblyopia therapy, as well, which she is still undergoing to correct her vision.

"I can't stress strongly enough the importance of the CVSI free vision screenings and paying attention, from a very young age, to those signals," Waldie stated. "Early detection of vision problems increases children's chances of achieving a successful treatment outcome. It truly can make a difference between thriving in school or failing."

This legacy includes the NPEF Western South Dakota Lions Children's Vision Screening Initiative (CVSI), which has brought over 30,000 free children's vision screenings to young children in communities across the Black Hills to insure early detection of childhood vision disorders.

During their tenure, as well, NPEF created the Dr. Paul L. Zimmerman Memorial Scholarship Endowment, launched in partnership with the University of South Dakota Foundation to pay tribute in perpetuity to the mission of Northern Plains Eye Foundation and the life of Dr. Zimmerman. The scholarship, presented by way of the University of South Dakota Sanford School of Medicine, is awarded annually to fourth year medical students pursuing ophthalmology to ensure quality eye care across the region for future generations.

Additionally, in the course of their leadership, NPEF began a collaboration with students at the University of South Dakota Sanford School of Medicine to conduct the first ever children's vision screening research studies in the state of South Dakota. To date, four ground-breaking studies have published in *South Dakota Medicine*, the South Dakota State Medical Association peer-reviewed medical journal. A fifth study, planned for submission in 2020, is nearing completion.

Linda, Terry, and Dallas, on behalf of the Northern Plains Eye Foundation, please accept our deepest gratitude for the very important role you played in the mission of our Foundation. Your passion, leadership, and dedication inspire us and will continue to guide our Foundation's legacy. We sincerely hope you enjoyed your role on our Board and very much look to your continued friendship.
